



2020 Session Gun & Hunting Bills - Synopses & Positions

Senate Gun Bills

[SB 0005](#) **Public Safety - Maryland Cyber Reserve - Established**
Pending review of bill text.

[SB 0039](#) **Public Safety – Regulated Firearm – Definition**
Adding Anderson Manufacturing AM-15 and AM-30 rifles to the list of so-called banned assault weapons. **OPPOSE**

[SB 0043](#) **Licensing - Fingerprint Requirement**
Creating an exemption from the fingerprint requirement for certain license applicants who have already been fingerprinted for various other reasons. Appears to conflict with FBI guidelines. **No Position**

[SB 0055](#) **Income Tax Checkoff – Maryland Assault Weapons Buyback Fund**
Creating seed money to promote an "Assault Weapons Buyback Fund" for the State to purchase or "buy-back" so-called and broadly defined "assault weapons," to **include** (under this section of the code only) handguns and Class 3 firearms, (i.e. machine guns). Maintaining the "buy-back" fund with voluntary contributions via a "check-off" box on Maryland income tax returns. Setting the prices the State will pay for "assault weapons." The program would be developed and administered by the Maryland State Police. **OPPOSE Unfavorable – Withdrawn by sponsor.**

[SB 0156](#) **Handgun Qualification License - Training Requirement – Exemption (cross-filed HB 0265)**

A carve out for law enforcement and correctional officers. Nothing in it for us. **No Position**

[SB 0179](#) **Firearms - Right to Purchase, Own, Possess, and Carry - Medical Cannabis (cross-filed HB 1582)**

A repeat of last year's ill-conceived bills to enable person with a medical cannabis license/prescription to purchase, possess and carry firearms. This runs contrary to existing federal law. **No Position**

[SB 0198](#) **Public Safety - Permit to Carry, Wear, or Transport a Handgun - Qualifications**
Clarifying that personal protection or self-defense can qualify as a good and substantial reason to carry, wear, or transport a handgun for purposes of the issuance by the Secretary of State Police of a permit to carry, wear, or transport a handgun. **SUPPORT**

[SB 0208](#) **Public Safety – Rifles and Shotguns – Secondary Transactions (cross-filed HB 4)**
Largely a copy of HB 786 as amended during the 2019 Session, severely limiting the loan of a rifle or shotgun except under certain limited circumstances, prohibiting the loan of a rifle or shotgun by a gun club, to a club member, and requiring NICS checks through a licensed dealer for the sale and transfer of a rifle or shotgun. Unneeded and unenforceable. Simply a springboard to launch more draconian legislation during the 2021 Session of the Maryland General Assembly. **OPPOSE.**

Senate Gun Bills (continued)

[SB 0273](#) **Crimes - Firearms - Penalties and Procedures (Violent Firearms Offender Act of 2020) (HB 0356)**

The Governor's crime bill, greatly increasing penalties for crimes involving the possession and or use of a firearm, knowingly transferring a firearm to a prohibited person, altering or obliterating a serial number, possession of a firearm by a prohibited person, etc. Providing for consecutive sentences rather the concurrent sentences under certain circumstances. **SUPPORT**

[SB 0290](#) **Criminal Procedure - Forfeiture of Firearms - Sale to Dealer (cross-file HB 1288)**

Authorizing a certain law enforcement unit to sell, exchange, or transfer certain forfeited firearms to a federally licensed firearms dealer as an alternative to destroying the firearm. **SUPPORT**

[SB 0327](#) **Public Safety - Handgun Qualification License - Training Exemption (HB 0047)**

Creating an exemption from the HQL training requirement which would apply to Maryland residents who are law enforcement officers serving in the surrounding contiguous states. **No Position**

[SB 0422](#) **Firearms - Permit to Carry, Wear, or Transport - Required Courses**

To require additional training on an annual basis as condition to maintaining a permit to carry a handgun. A punitive and unnecessary measure which appears intended to make the possession of a permit to carry a handgun as onerous and expensive as possible. **OPPOSE**

[SB 0459](#) **Public Schools - School Resource Officers - Firearms Required**

Revising existing law to require rather than simply allow Baltimore City school police officers to carry a firearm on the premises of the school to which the officer is assigned. **SUPPORT**

[SB 0468](#) **Criminal Procedure - Appeals - Unlawful Possession of a Firearm (cross-file HB 1085)**

To allow the state to appeal trial court decisions in cases involving certain offenses under certain additional sections of the law. **No Position**

[SB 0506](#) **Firearms - Handgun Permit - Preliminary Approval**

Streamlining the application process to enable an applicant to apply for preliminary approval of a permit application without having to first complete the required training course. A cost saving measure due to the vagueness of the "good and substantial" requirement. Providing a certain time period to complete the necessary training course after receiving preliminary approval. Essentially a revision of the sequence of events. **SUPPORT**

Senate Gun Bills (continued)

SB 0646 Public Safety - Access to Firearms - Storage Requirements (cross-filed HB 0636)

A greatly expanded version of the existing “trigger lock” law. Redefining the age when locks are required from 16 years to 18 years by removing the definition of a child as an individual under the age of 16 and substituting the term “minor” which is defined under existing law as an individual under the age of 18. Eliminating the exemption when the minor has taken the DNR hunter safety course. Expanding the law to cover all firearms whether loaded or unloaded. Changing the existing term “would” which indicated probability to “could” which means a possibility. Even safes are not impregnable, so the term “could” essentially making it illegal to own a firearm in a house where an unsupervised minor could be present. Greatly increasing penalties for a minor gaining access and holding the owner criminally responsible if a minor gains access and the minor or other person is harmed. **OPPOSE**

SB 0664 Declaration of Rights - Right to Privacy

Stating that the right to privacy may not be infringed without a showing of compelling state interest. However, this is a “Trojan Horse” amendment to the Maryland Constitution violating the right to privacy for gun owners for the purchase of firearms or ammunition. Violates equal protection under the U. S. Constitution. **OPPOSE**

SB 0672 Criminal Law - Theft of a Handgun

Amending existing law concerning theft of property to separately address the theft of a handgun. Classifying the theft of a handgun as a felony rather than a misdemeanor. Providing penalties for a first offense from a mandatory minimum of 2 years to a maximum of 5 years and/or fine of up to \$1,000. Increased penalties for subsequent offenses. Requiring that firearm theft penalty shall be consecutive to a sentence for any other offense. **SUPPORT.**

SB 0674 Gun Theft Felony Act of 2020 (cross-filed HB 0914)

Amending existing law concerning theft of property to separately address the theft of a firearm, including an antique firearm, or replica of an antique firearm. Classifying the theft of a firearm as a felony rather than a misdemeanor. Providing penalties for a first offense from a mandatory minimum of 2 years to a maximum of 5 years and/or fine of up to \$1,000. Increased penalties for subsequent offenses. Requiring that handgun theft penalty shall be consecutive to a sentence for any other offense. **SUPPORT.**

Senate Gun Bills (continued)

[SB 0816](#) **Public Safety - Licensed Firearms Dealers (Firearms Dealers' Safety Act)** (cross-file HB 1257)

This bill has nothing to do with dealer safety, and everything to do with placing draconian burdens on licensed gun dealers. Requires electronic record keeping, audio and video recordings of all receipts, sales and other dispositions, such recordings shall be kept for at least one year. These recordings shall be given to the Secretary upon written request (no warrant or subpoena required).

Each firearms dealer will be required develop a written standard operating procedure for security to include, locks, exterior lighting, surveillance camera and an alarm system.

Requiring that a dealer do a background check on all employees, including fingerprints, prior to hiring and on all employees annually.

Making the dealer liable for the acts of a person to whom the firearm was sold, rented, or transferred.

Requiring that during business hours, each firearm shall be in a locking display case or another secure location which is inaccessible to customers. Also requiring that each firearm displayed to a customer be rendered inoperable with a trigger lock or other mechanism.

Requiring that during non-business hours, all firearms be stored in a vault, a safe or a reinforced display case with shatterproof glass. **OPPOSE.**

[SB 0880](#) **Firearms - Dealer's License and Handgun Permit - Notice of Expiration**

Requiring the Maryland State Police to give firearms dealers and carry permit holders advance written renewal notice 60 days prior to the expiration date of a license or carry permit. **SUPPORT**

[SB 0881](#) **Firearms - Handgun Qualification License - Firearms Safety Training**

Removing any requirement that a person demonstrate safe handling and operation of a firearm; e.g. hands on with a firearm and live fire. **No Position**

[SB 0958](#) **Criminal Law - Untraceable Firearms (cross-filed HB 0910)**

An expanded version of previous 3D printer legislation to include prohibition on transferring software (1st Amendment violation), manufacturing so-called undetectable firearms, firearms without serial numbers, manufacturing firearms to resemble key chains, cigarette lighters, wallets, etc. Clearly violates the right to build a personal firearm. **OPPOSE**

[SB 0968](#) **Baltimore City - Imitation Firearms - Prohibition (cross-file HB 1160)**

Similar to existing Baltimore City legislation [16-0761](#) enacted in December of 2016, and applies only to Baltimore City. Prohibits the sale, offer to sell, or display of an imitation firearm. Provides a \$500 fine for a first offense, and \$1000 fine for a second offense. **OPPOSE**

Senate Gun Bills (continued)

[SB 1047](#) **Office of the Attorney General - Firearm Crime – Study (cross-file HB 1629)**

A totally unnecessary near duplication of a bill passed during the 2019 Session. The major difference being that last year's version was amended to place the responsibility under the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention rather than under the office of the Maryland Attorney General (Brian Frosh). This version again assigns the duties to the office of the Maryland Attorney, probably to make sure the results suit the liberals anti-gun paradigm. **OPPOSE**

[SB 1050](#) **Public Safety - Lost or Stolen Regulated Firearm – Reporting (cross-file HB 591)**

Doubling the sentences and fines for failing to report a stolen firearm. Doubling the proposed penalty for a first offense for and for a subsequent offense. Changing the offense from a civil offense to a criminal offense. **OPPOSE**

[SB 1074](#) **Public Safety - Regulated Firearms – Transfer (cross-file HB 1104)**

Defining "transfer" as a sale, rental, furnishing, gift, loan or any other delivery with or without compensation. Excludes a temporary change in possession when the transferor has no reason to believe the transferee intends to commit a crime; AND only when in the actual presence of the transferor. Effectively repeals legislation we backed last session. **OPPOSE**

House Gun Bills

[HB 0004](#) **Public Safety – Rifles and Shotguns – Secondary Transactions (SB 0208)**

Largely a copy of HB 786 as amended during the 2019 Session, severely limiting the loan of a rifle or shotgun except under certain limited circumstances, prohibiting the loan of a rifle or shotgun by a gun club, to a club member, and requiring NICS checks through a licensed dealer for the sale and transfer of a rifle or shotgun. Unneeded and unenforceable. **OPPOSE.**

[HB 0035](#) **Public Safety – Firearm Telematics – Study**

Seeks to compel a Maryland State Police study on means for installing GPS tracking devices in firearms to locate lost and/or stolen firearms. Potentially useful in tracking the whereabouts of legally owned firearms and firearm owners. **OPPOSE**

[HB 0047](#) **Public Safety – Handgun Qualification License – Training Exemption (SB 0327)**

Creating an exemption from the HQL training requirement which would apply to Maryland residents who are law enforcement officers serving in the surrounding contiguous states. **No Position**

[HB 0073](#) **Firearms - Right to Purchase, Own, Possess, and Carry - Medical Cannabis**

A repeat of last year's ill-conceived bill to enable person with a medical cannabis license/prescription to purchase, possess and carry firearms. This runs contrary to existing federal law. **No Position**

[HB 0265](#) **Handgun Qualification License - Training Requirement – Exemption (SB 0156)**

A carve out for law enforcement and correctional officers. Nothing in it for us. **No Position**

[HB 0302](#) **Criminal Law - Deadly Weapons on School Property - Nonpublic Schools (No Weapons on Nonpublic School Property Act)**

Far more significant than the title would seem to indicate. This marks a blatant attempt by the Maryland General Assembly to ban the possession of firearms on the property of privately owned schools. A first step to banning the possession of firearms on personal private property. **OPPOSE**

[HB 0356](#) **Crimes - Firearms - Penalties and Procedures (Violent Firearms Offender Act of 2020) (SB 0273)**

The Governor's crime bill, greatly increasing penalties for crimes involving the possession and or use of a firearm, knowingly transferring a firearm to a prohibited person, altering or obliterating a serial number, possession of a firearm by a prohibited person, etc. Providing for consecutive sentences rather the concurrent sentences under certain circumstances. **SUPPORT**

[HB 0591](#) **Public Safety – Lost or Stolen Regulated Firearm – Reporting**

Doubling the sentences and fines for failing to report a stolen firearm. Doubling the proposed penalty for a first offence for any subsequent offense. Changing the offense from a civil offense to a criminal offense. **OPPOSE**

House Gun Bills (continued)

[HB 0618](#) **Sales and Use Tax – Exemption – Firearm Safety Devices**

A simple bill exempting the purchase of certain firearm safety devices from any Maryland sales and use taxes. **SUPPORT**

[HB 0636](#) **Public Safety – Access to Firearms – Storage Requirements (SB 0646)**

A greatly expanded version of the existing “trigger lock” law. Redefining the age when locks are required from 16 years to 18 years by removing the definition of a child as an individual under the age of 16 and substituting the term “minor” which is defined under existing law as an individual under the age of 18. Eliminating the exemption when the minor has taken the DNR hunter safety course. Expanding the law to cover all firearms whether loaded or unloaded. Changing the existing term “would” which indicated probability to “could” which means a possibility. Even safes are not impregnable, so the term “could” essentially making it illegal to own a firearm in a house where an unsupervised minor could be present. [HB 0910](#) **Criminal Law - Untraceable Firearms (cross-filed SB 0958)**

An expanded version of previous 3D printer legislation to include prohibition on transferring software (1st Amendment violation), manufacturing undetectable firearms, firearms without serial numbers, manufacturing firearms to resemble key chains, cigarette lighters, wallets, etc. **OPPOSE**

[HB 0914](#) **Gun Theft Felony Act of 2020 (cross-file SB 0674)**

Amending existing law concerning theft of property to separately address the theft of a handgun. Classifying the theft of a handgun as a felony rather than a misdemeanor. Providing penalties for a first offense from a mandatory minimum of 2 years to a maximum of 5 years and/or fine of \$1000. Increased penalties for subsequent offenses. Requiring that handgun theft penalty shall run consecutively to any other penalty for other crimes. **SUPPORT**

[HB 0968](#) **Regulated Firearms - Straw Purchase – Penalties**

Minor language changes, making a straw purchase a felony, minimum sentences for a first offence, increased penalties with mandatory minimum sentences. **SUPPORT**

[HB 1078](#) **Public Safety - Education - Firearm Funding (No Funding for Firearms Act)**

Prohibiting a county board of education or public school from spending any money from any source to directly or indirectly provide a teacher with a firearm or train a teacher in the use of a firearm; and providing the Act does not apply to a school-approved sport or club that makes use of firearms. Does not prohibit free training provided by volunteer instructors; not does it prohibit donations to a private fund to purchase firearms for teachers. **OPPOSE.**

House Gun Bills (continued)

[HB 1085](#) **Criminal Procedure - Appeals - Unlawful Possession of a Firearm (cross-file SB 0468)**

To allow the state to appeal trial court decisions in cases involving certain offenses under certain additional sections of the law. **No Position**

[HB 1104](#) **Public Safety - Regulated Firearms – Transfer (cross-file SB 1074)**

Defining “transfer” as a sale, rental, furnishing, gift, loan or any other delivery with or without compensation. Excludes a temporary change in possession when the transferor has no reason to believe the transferee intends to commit a crime; AND only when in the actual presence of the transferor. Effectively repeals legislation we backed last session. **OPPOSE**

[HB 1160](#) **Baltimore City - Imitation Firearms - Prohibition (cross-file SB 0968)**

Similar to existing Baltimore City legislation [16-0761](#) enacted in December of 2016, and applies only to Baltimore City. Prohibits the sale, offer to sell, or display of an imitation firearm. Provides a \$500 fine for a first offense, and \$1000 fine for a second offense. **OPPOSE**

[HB 1241](#) **Firearms - Law Enforcement - Patrol Responsibilities (Retail Firearm Business Protection Act)**

A modest proposal which would require the law enforcement agencies in each jurisdiction to work with the firearms dealers in the agencies’ jurisdiction to establish a policy that at least one patrol officer will visit a business to monitor and inspect the business each night during non-business hours. (Which is something they should be doing already.) **SUPPORT**

House Gun Bills (continued)

[HB 1257](#) **Public Safety - Licensed Firearms Dealers (Firearms Dealers' Safety Act)** **(cross-file SB 0816)**

This bill has nothing to do with dealer safety, and everything to do with placing draconian burdens on licensed gun dealers. Requires electronic record keeping, audio and video recordings of all receipts, sales and other dispositions, such recordings shall be kept for at least one year. These recordings shall be given to the Secretary upon written request (no warrant or subpoena required).

Each firearms dealer will be required develop a written standard operating procedure for security to include, locks, exterior lighting, surveillance camera and an alarm system.

Requiring that a dealer do a background check on all employees, including fingerprints, prior to hiring and on all employees annually.

Making the dealer liable for the acts of a person to whom the firearm was sold, rented, or transferred.

Requiring that during business hours, each firearm shall be in a locking display case or another secure location which is inaccessible to customers. Also requiring that each firearm displayed to a customer be rendered inoperable with a trigger lock or other mechanism.

Requiring that during non-business hours, all firearms be stored in a vault, a safe or a reinforced display case with shatterproof glass. **OPPOSE.**

[HB 1261](#) **Weapon Crimes - Assault Long Guns and Copycat Weapons**

Dramatically altering the criteria of what constitutes a copycat assault long gun to include virtually all AR style rifles and pistols in the category of copycats of banned assault long guns. Including semi-automatic shotguns with a pistol grip in the list of assault long guns. Providing for an escalating fee structure for registering existing firearms with the Maryland State Police. Providing criminal penalties up to 1 year for each unregistered firearm. **OPPOSE.**

[HB 1267](#) **Public Safety – Handgun Permit – Church Property (Worshipper Protection Act of 2020)**

Providing exceptions to some of the transport restrictions contained in Criminal Law Article §4-203 by modifying the Public Safety Article to allow persons who have permission from the governing board of a church to wear and carry a handgun for the protection of self and others while on the property of the church and to transport the handgun to and from the church. Requires advance notice of the church policy to the primary law enforcement agency in the county where the church is located. **SUPPORT**

House Gun Bills (continued)

HB 1268 Public Safety – Pilot Program – Handgun Permit – Church Property

Providing exceptions to some of the transport restrictions contained in Criminal Law Article §4-203 by modifying the Public Safety Article to allow persons who have permission from the governing board of a church to wear and carry a handgun for the protection of self and others while on the property of a church in Harford County ONLY and to transport the handgun to and from the church. Requires advance notice of the church policy to the Harford County Sheriff. It is unclear what the policy will be if a churchgoer is not a Harford County resident. **No Position**

HB 1288 Criminal Procedure - Forfeiture of Firearms - Sale to Dealer (cross-file SB 0290)

Authorizing a certain law enforcement unit to sell, exchange, or transfer certain forfeited firearms to a federally licensed firearms dealer as an alternative to destroying the firearm. **SUPPORT**

HB 1501 Public Safety – Regulated Firearms – Reporting Loss or Theft

Altering existing law to reduce the time allowed to report the discovery of the loss or theft of a regulated firearm from 72 hours to 48 hours. More symbolic than substantive because law enforcement simply takes a loss/theft report. It does not necessarily trigger an active police investigation absent another crime. Under federal law, dealers are already required to report a loss or theft within 48 hours, so the impact is on private citizens only. **OPPOSE**

HB 1502 Handgun Permits - Qualifications - High Risk Occupations

Defining certain occupations (e.g. correctional officers, parole officers, emergency services, physicians, etc.) as “high risk” and thus qualifying as a good and substantial reason for a permit to wear and carry a handgun. **SUPPORT**

HB 1582 Firearms - Right to Purchase, Own, Possess, and Carry - Medical Cannabis (cross-filed SB 179)

A repeat of last year's ill-conceived bills to enable person with a medical cannabis license/prescription to purchase, possess and carry firearms. This runs contrary to existing federal law. **No Position**

HB 1607 Public Safety - Permit to Carry, Wear, or Transport a Handgun - Qualifications

Clarifying that personal protection or self-defense can qualify as a good and substantial reason to carry, wear, or transport a handgun for purposes of the issuance by the Secretary of State Police of a permit to carry, wear, or transport a handgun. **SUPPORT**

HB 1628 Sales and Use Tax - Rate Reduction and Services

While intended to fund Kirwan Commission recommendations for funding education, this bill will tax firearms training, gunsmithing, range rental, etc. **Oppose**

House Gun Bills (continued)

[HB 1629](#) **Office of the Attorney General - Firearm Crime – Study (cross-file SB 1047)**

A totally unnecessary near duplication of a bill passed during the 2019 Session. The major difference being that last year's version was amended to place the responsibility under the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention rather than under the office of the Maryland Attorney General (Brian Frosh). This version again assigns the duties to the office of the Maryland Attorney, probably to make sure the results suit the liberals anti-gun paradigm. **OPPOSE**

[HB 1650](#) **Criminal Law - Third-Degree Assault**

Modifying the crime of assault and battery to make battery with a firearm a unique offense.

[SB 0086](#) Fishing and Hunting Rights

Declaring that the State should (not shall) forever preserve residents' right to hunt and fish, subject to such laws the Maryland General Assembly enacts. **SUPPORT**

[SB 0142](#) Natural Resources - Recreational License Donation Program and Healing Hunting and Fishing Fund – Revisions

Pending review of bill text.

[SB 0242](#) Natural Resources - Wild Waterfowl Policy - Repeal

[HB 0068](#) **North Point State Park - Deer Bow Hunting Season - Establishment**
Requiring the Department of Natural Resources to establish an annual deer bow hunting season for North Point State Park; and requiring the Department to adopt regulations specifying the length of the deer bow hunting season and the areas of North Point State Park that will be open for deer bow hunting. **SUPPORT**

[HB 0173](#) **Natural Resources - Sunday Hunting**
Clarifying certain provisions of law governing Sunday hunting in the State; establishing the authority of the Department of Natural Resources to allow Sunday hunting under certain circumstances; authorizing Sunday hunting on certain public land; altering the application of authorized Sunday hunting to junior hunts; prohibiting hunting on certain public land on Sunday; etc.. **SUPPORT**

[HB 0236](#) **Hunting and Fishing Licenses – Active Military, Former Prisoners of War, Recipients of the Purple Heart Award, and Disabled Veterans (SB 0025)**
Repealing a sunset provision and making permanent a requirement that the DNR report various data on the number of hunting and fishing licenses issued to recipients of the Purple Heart. **No Position**

[HB 0827](#) **Montgomery Co. - Agricultural Reserve - Deer Management Permits MC 06–20**

[HB 0863](#) **Natural Resources - Organized Hunting Contests – Restrictions**

[HB 1129](#) **Talbot County - Turkey and Deer Hunting – Sundays (cross-file SB 0500)**
